- e. Tell me about the roles in your family.
- f. Tell me about your marriage customs.
- g. Tell me the importance of your family.
- h. Tell me about your worship practices and customs.
- i. Tell me about what you believe makes a person good.
- j. Tell me what frightens you.
- k. What is your greatest worry?
- I. Tell me about your housing in your country.
- m. Tell me about your religion.
- n. Tell me what you know about Jesus.
- o. Can I tell you about my life?
